## **Occupational Health**

### Staff & physician screening

- Based on the provincial briefing yesterday, the staff and physician self-assessment tool has been updated to reflect <u>ONE</u> of the following new or worsening symptom:
  - Fever greater than 38° Celsius (or signs of a fever such as chills, sweats, muscle aches and light headedness)
  - o Cough
  - Sore throat or difficulty swallowing
  - Headache
  - Unusual fatigue
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Vomiting or diarrhea
  - Runny nose or congested nose
  - Loss of sense of smell or taste

 Chilblain-like lesions on feet and/or hands (small, red or purple spots on hands and/or feet).

Employees and physicians <u>must</u> continue to complete the self-screening daily. Please ensure you are using the most up-to-date screening tool, which can be found <u>here</u>.

Do not come to work if you have any **one** of the above symptoms.

### Public Health recommendations for those who participated in specific events

Public health is advising anyone who participated in the following events on the specified dates and times listed below to self-isolate for 14 days.

- Students in Grades 7-12 and other individuals who attended parties or gatherings of 10 or more people with these students in the metro area on February 5-7;
- Students in Grades 7-12 and other individuals who played team sports with students in the metro area on February 5-7, which includes individuals who live outside of the metro area who played on the same or opposing teams or played in a tournament; and,
- Individuals who coached or assisted with team sports in Grades 7-12 who played games or practiced in the metro area on February 5-7.

Individuals in the above groups are asked to self-isolate away from household members for 14 days from the date of the last gathering or game they attended, or from their last contact with a positive case, whichever is more recent.

If someone in your home is self-isolating and cannot stay in a separate area from others in the home, then everyone in the household needs to self-isolate.

Household members of individuals affected by these advisories are not required to isolate unless they or their household member experience symptoms of COVID-19 and/or tests positive for COVID-19.

### **Public Health Measures**

### Documents updated to reflect new COVID-19 screening criteria

Based on today's updated on screening criteria, all internal documents have been updated accordingly to reflect this change. Please ensure you are using the most up to date documents that can be found here.

**Public safety practices** – With an increase in COVID-19 numbers this week, public safety practices must be always top of mind. Please continue to:

- Wear a mask.
- Practice physical distancing.
- Wash your hands regularly.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Frequently clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces.
- If you are sick, stay home and complete the COVID-19 screening tool.

### Physical distance in common spaces

- Physical distancing guidelines are applicable to all staff and physicians where physical distancing can reasonably occur, such as in common areas and during breaks.
- Masks and physical distance must be maintained during breaks. During a lunch break when you
  need to remove your mask, you must ensure physical distance is maintained from all others
  around you.
- When teams need to be within close proximity (within 6 feet of each other) to complete required work, such as direct patient care and assembly lines, as per PPE guidelines, staff and physicians must wear the appropriate PPE and take necessary precautions.
- We remind staff and physicians that "work bubbles" do not exist, and that all staff are required to follow public health measures while working.

# **Important to Note**

### New temporary Work From Home (WFH) arrangements

If you are an employee who is considering a new temporary Work From Home (WFH) arrangement for COVID-19 reasons (i.e., child/isolation reasons), please contact your manager to request a temporary WFH arrangement. Management have been provided with the temporary WFH instructions. Once you are approved to temporarily WFH, your manager will email you an approval letter with detailed technology/Human Resources/Occupational Health instructions.

Please note, this temporary WFH approval process is only an option for employees who:

- Already have EH laptops, or
- Have a personal computer at home which can successfully install the Windows Virtual Desktop (WVD).

### Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)

Due to the ongoing increase in Covid cases in the metro St. John's region, delivery of BLS and ACLS in the St. John's metro region will be suspended until March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. This date is subject to extension depending on the situation with cases. At this point, delivery of BLS outside of St. John's metro will continue. All instructors and participants are reminded to follow the existing IPAC guidelines, wearing of masks and social distancing.
