Newfoundland and Labrador COVID-19 Immunization Plan

The Department of Health has released its COVID-19 vaccination plan, which includes three phases.

Phase One includes health care providers at high risk of exposure to COVID-19, and those who are directly involved in the pandemic response. It runs from December 2020 to March 2021. Phase One is led by RHA Public Health teams. Clinic locations will continue to be communicated by the RHAs to priority groups.

Phase Two includes frontline health care providers who were not immunized in Phase One and who may come into direct contact with patients (includes private health care workers). It runs from April 2021 to June 2021. (Note, the list that appears in the Plan of those included in Phase Two is not in order of priority.) Vaccination clinics will be organized across the province. A pre-registration system has been launched to help plan and coordinate appointments. Pre-registration is now available for anyone aged 70 years and older. Physicians younger than 70 and others in Phase Two priority groups will be able to pre-register for the vaccine in mid-March. This approach will help manage volume. NLMA is meeting with the Department next week to discuss logistics and vaccination of physicians. More details will be distributed as we learn more.

A to F from February 26 to 28

G to L from March 1 to 3
