# **COVID-19 Update**

# Employee and Physician Information



## October 27, 2021

- October 12 to 25 116 new cases
  - o 82 in Eastern Health
  - o 8 in Western Health
  - o 25 in Central Health
  - o 1 in Labrador-Grenfell Health
- Total number cases: 1,964
- Active cases: 90\*
- Recovered cases: 1,852
- Total number deaths: 15
- Total number in hospital: 1

- Total vaccine doses administered in NL: 861,478 (as of October 25, 2021).
- # health-care workers (HCW) vaccinated in the Eastern Health region (as of October 25, 2021):
  - 732 HCW are partially vaccinated (one dose), and
  - 24,892 HCW are fully vaccinated (two doses)

## **Provincial COVID-19 Update**

- Marystown-Burin Area is in Alert Level 3.
  - There is a cluster in the Marystown area. As of Tuesday, October 26, there have been 69 confirmed cases of COVID-19 connected to the cluster.

## **Visitor Restrictions (Burin Peninsula)**

- Temporary visitor restrictions are in place for hospital patients and long-term care and personal care home residents at all facilities and sites on the Burin Peninsula, due to an increase in COVID-19 cases and ongoing investigation in the area.
- Two designated visitors and a support person (if required) are permitted for inpatients in a hospital setting and residents of long-term care homes.

## **Mandatory Vaccination Policy**

The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador announced its <u>Mandatory Vaccination</u>
 <u>Policy</u> that applies to public service employees in core provincial government departments, as well as agencies, boards and commissions. More information:

- By December 17, 2021, all provincial government employees are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or have an approved medical exemption.
- The mandatory vaccination policy will apply to Eastern Health staff, physicians, students and volunteers as well as on-site vendors, suppliers and contractors.

- Eastern Health will share additional information as it becomes available (i.e.: exemption process, how proof of vaccination will be provided to the employer, etc.).

## **Vaccine Passport (Visitors)**

- Effective October 22, 2021, in line with provincial <u>vaccine passport guidelines</u>, visitors to long-term care facilities, personal care homes and community care homes are required to present proof of COVID-19 vaccination status or an approved medical exemption.
- Visitors, ages 12 years and older, are asked to present the following upon entry: Digital/paper QR code or copy of an official vaccination record (proof of COVID-19 vaccination status) and identification with name and date of birth (name on vaccination passport/record must match ID).
- Children under the age of 12 can visit when accompanied by an adult who is eligible to visit. As per provincial vaccine passport guidelines, children have three months from their 12th birthday to get fully vaccinated.

## **Vaccine Passport (Guidance for Residents - General)**

- As per <u>provincial guidelines</u>, individuals must be <u>fully vaccinated</u> or have an <u>approved medical exemption</u> in order to access certain businesses and settings.
- Proof of vaccination or an approved medical exemption is required for visitors to long-term care facilities, personal care homes and community care homes.
- Proof of vaccination is not required for other health-care facilities, including private health clinics.
- Note: people entering businesses and settings for work purposes have until December 17, 2021 to be fully vaccinated.

#### **Travel Restrictions**

• **Travel outside of the province**: As per the provincial government, Newfoundland and Labrador's participation in the Atlantic Canada bubble was <u>suspended on September 30, 2021</u>.

- Staff who are returning from travel outside of Newfoundland and Labrador (excluding communities along the Labrador-Quebec border, Labrador City, Wabush, Fermont, the Labrador Straits area and Blanc Sablon) that are fully vaccinated and do not have symptoms are NOT required to isolate.
- However, staff who are partially or unvaccinated must self-isolate until they receive negative results from a test taken on day 7 or later and call Occupational Health upon return; staff are directed to report any symptoms to Occupational Health during the required self-isolation period.
- As an employee, if you are planning to travel outside of the province, you must discuss this with your manager in advance. The isolation period (as applicable) will be taken into consideration when requesting/approving leave. Also, please be advised that isolation requirements upon return to the province are subject to change at any time based on current epidemiology.

#### Flu Vaccines

- Getting a flu shot is important every year, and particularly important during the COVID-19
  pandemic. While the flu shot will not protect against COVID-19, it will help reduce the risk of
  getting the flu which, if combined with COVID-19, could result in a higher risk for severe illness.
- Getting vaccinated will also help reduce the spread of influenza in our communities and help reduce the impact on the health-care system.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccines**

- Eastern Health continues to support the scientific, evidence-based approach and advice of the World Health Organization (WHO), the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC), Health Canada, the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI), and the Chief Medical Officer of Health in regard to the safety and effectiveness of vaccination against COVID-19.
- Eastern Health is awaiting Health Canada's decision regarding approval of the COVID-19 vaccine
  in children, ages 5 to 11. More information (Health Canada Statement): <u>Health Canada receives

- COVID-19 vaccine clinics continue to be available across the region. Clinics are available for first and second doses for individuals 12 years and older. - Due to the high demand, the Village Mall COVID-19 vaccine clinic is currently by appointment only and is no longer accepting walk-ins. This process will be monitored daily. <u>More</u> <u>information: PSA (October 26).</u>

- Important to note: Due to increased demand, appointments are strongly recommended.

Walk-ins will be accepted as capacity allows in all clinics, with the exception of the Village Mall.
- Third COVID-19 Vaccine Dose (Moderately to Severely Immunocompromised Individuals):
   Eastern Health is offering a third COVID-19 vaccine dose to individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised, including those receiving immunosuppressive therapies who may have a lower immune response to COVID-19 vaccines compared to the general population.

## **Reminders: Social Distancing and Masking Requirements**

- Staff/students/physicians/volunteers are reminded to please keep a distance of six feet between co-workers when eating/drinking and when unmasked.
- Mask usage and physical distancing are part of a comprehensive plan to support prevention and control measures that can limit the spread of COVID-19. Everyone's safety depends on the appropriate use of a mask and physical distancing practices.
- <u>Social distancing</u>: There is no such thing as a "work bubble" with colleagues; while in the
  workplace, staff are required to follow the guidelines below (re: mask wearing and physical
  distancing) when they are with co-workers in break rooms, cafeterias, workspaces, elevators,
  etc.
  - Eat/drink only in designated areas, e.g., break rooms, cafeterias.
  - o Keep a distance of six feet between others when unmasked while eating and drinking.
  - Masks can only be removed in designated eating areas or when alone in an office space;
     masks are required in shared spaces and common areas.
  - Masks are also required when working behind plexiglass with openings and interacting/working with the public.
  - Staff are also reminded to please maintain social distancing while using elevators.
- Mask compliance: Regardless of vaccination status, mask compliance continues to be
  mandatory for all Eastern Health employees, students, physicians and volunteers while in an
  Eastern Health facility, or while working for the organization outside of an Eastern Health
  site/facility, such as during home visits by staff in the community, at community-leased sites and
  at vaccination clinics. Questions regarding mask usage in Eastern Health facilities can be

## **Reminders: Infection Prevention and Control & Workplace Safety**

- Mask compliance audit: Staff should continue to conduct visual audits on mask compliance
  within Eastern Health facilities and to complete the online survey based upon what they have
  observed during their workday. Each area/unit is expected to complete a minimum of one audit
